9-1-2-a — *Specifically Prohibited Acts and Conduct*

Most UNS fouls are “non-contact”

CELEBRATORY ACTIONS

Throat Slash

Demonstration of Violence, such as “six guns” or “Machine gun”

Removal of Helmet to celebrate or protest

Heisman Pose

Gestures with a Sexual Connotation

Dancing

Somersault or Flip

High Stepping

Dunking the Ball over the Crossbar

Spinning the Ball

TAUNTING ACTIONS

Standing over an Opponent

Clapping in the face of an Opponent

Pointing at an Opponent or the Opponent's bench

Getting in the Face of / Tossing the Ball at an Opponent



VERBAL TAUNTING

Typically Handled by a “talk to”



UNS CONTACT FOULS

Dead Ball Contact that Happens clearly after the Ball is Dead

Using Forcible Contact to Push or Pull an Opponent off a pile



MECHANICS AND SITUATIONS

Accordion after each play, prevent with presence

Move with Purpose but always keep your “cone of vision” wide

Change of Possession and other “Big” Plays
